

Troop Volunteer Roles

Groups of Girl Scouts from the same community, called troops, typically meet weekly or biweekly for an hour or two. Hand in hand with adult volunteers, Girl Scouts complete exciting activities and projects, explore their neighborhoods, and make new friends. Adult volunteers are a vital part of a dynamic Girl Scout experience.

Troop Leadership

- Oversees function of the troop while helping Girl Scouts have fun with a purpose
- Manages troop business, documentation and paperwork, and receives communication from council

Troop Product Program Chairs

- Coordinate the annual Cookie Program and/or Fall Product Program
- Set up cookie booths
- Manage inventory

Troop Treasurer

- Manages troop's funds
- Assists with budgeting and financial planning
- Manages troop's bank account
- Completes required finance communications with Council staff

Adult Volunteer

- Provides snacks as needed
- Helps with crafts and activities as needed to ensure troop meetings run smoothly
- Field Trip Driver provides safe, reliable transportation for troop outings
